# 2021 Alberta Wage and Salary Survey

Agriculture industry summary report

#### Overview

The Alberta Wage and Salary Survey is undertaken by the Alberta government to provide current wage rates and skill shortage information on various occupations in Alberta, and in specific industries and economic regions. This labour market information helps Alberta employers to fine-tune their compensation and recruitment strategies, helps individuals make career and education choices, and aids the provincial government in developing effective policies and providing services.

# **Survey results**

The survey was completed with 145 employers in the Agriculture sector who provided information on over 3,216 employees in various occupational classifications<sup>1</sup>. Survey data were collected between January and August 2021. Alberta Wage and Salary Survey results by four-digit National Occupational Classification (NOC) for all of Alberta, by industry group, and by geographic area can be found at <u>www.alis.alberta.ca/occinfo</u>

A modest number of survey completions was obtained from employers in this industry. Many small agriculture operations would not have met the criteria for inclusion in the survey sample (ten or more employees in Calgary and Edmonton regions; five or more employees in other regions). Some occupations reported here are associated with lower levels of statistical reliability.

## Wages for selected occupations

The following table illustrates the wage survey results associated with some common occupations within this industry<sup>2</sup>. The tables below present results for three-digit NOC minor groups and for four-digit NOCs.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The estimated sample error at the establishment level for overall results for this industry is estimated to be ±8.4% at a 95% confidence level (i.e., 19 times out of 20) taking into account the sample design effect associated with over/under sampling and data weighting.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Occupations were selected as the top occupations in terms of number of employees as per Statistics Canada 2016 Census for this industry and supplemented by other occupations frequently reported by industry employers. Only occupations with a minimum number of reportable observations were selected. Some occupations common to this industry may not be listed if sufficient reliable data were not available.

"n" in the above table represents the number of employers who indicated at least one employee in an occupation. For example, 25 employers combined reported wages for 308 Nursery and greenhouse workers (NOC 8432).

Averages are calculated using data weighted by establishment to account for survey non-response (stratified by region, industry group and employer size) and by number of employees reported.

"n/a" indicates that results have been suppressed due to missing data for some employers or due to calculation anomalies.

Data Reliability Codes are based on coefficient of variation as an indicator of general reliability: "A": coefficient of variation of less than or equal to  $\pm 6.00\%$ , "B": from  $\pm 6.01\%$  to  $\pm 15.00\%$ , "C": from  $\pm 15.01\%$  to  $\pm 33.00\%$ , "D": more than  $\pm 33.01\%$ .

"n" in the above table represents the range of the number of employers who indicated at least one employee in an occupation and responded to individual questions about hiring difficulties and vacancies (not all employers responded to all questions).

"n/a" indicates that results have been suppressed due to missing data for some employers.

Statistics on hiring activity, hiring difficulties, and employers reporting vacancies were calculated based on *the number of employers responding* for each question, weighted by establishment for survey non-response (stratified by region, industry group and employer size).

Job Vacancy Rate for vacancies that had been unfilled for 4 months or more calculated as: Sum of Unfilled Vacancies / (Sum of Current Employees + Sum of Unfilled Vacancies), with data weighted by establishment for survey non-response (stratified by industry group and employer size).

## Industry Definition as per North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)

#### Agriculture Sector (NAICS 111, 112, 1151, 1152)

For this survey, the Agriculture industry group is composed of four NAICS subsectors.

The Crop production subsector (NAICS 111) comprises of establishments, such as farms, orchards, groves, greenhouses and nurseries, primarily engaged in growing crops, plants, vines, trees and their seeds (excluding those engaged in forestry operations). Industries have been created taking into account input factors, such as suitable land, climatic conditions, type of equipment, and the amount and type of labour required. The production process is typically completed when the raw product or commodity grown reaches the farm gate for market, that is, at the point of first sale or price determination.

Establishments in these industries may use traditional crop production methods, employ modified or improved crop inputs, or engage in organic crop production. An establishment is classified within this subsector provided that 50 per cent or more of the establishment's agricultural production consists of crops. Establishments with 50 per cent or more crop production and with no one product or family of products accounting for 50 per cent of the production are treated as combination crop farms and classified to All other crop farming (NAICS 11199), except if 50 per cent or more of the production is a combination of oilseeds and grains, in which case they are classified to Other grain farming (NAICS 1119)

The Animal production and aquaculture subsector (NAICS 112) comprises of establishments, such as ranches, farms and feedlots, primarily engaged in raising animals, producing animal products and fattening animals. Industries have been created taking into account input factors such as suitable grazing or pasture land, specialized buildings, type of equipment, and the amount and type of labour required.

An establishment is classified within this subsector provided that 50 per cent or more of the establishment's agricultural production consists of animal production or aquaculture. Establishments with 50 per cent or more animal production or aquaculture and with no one product or family of products accounting for 50 per cent of the production are treated as combination animal farms and classified to All other animal production (NAICS 11299).

Establishments not classified to any other industry, primarily engaged in raising animals, such as llamas, bison, wild boar, deer, elk, worms, crickets, laboratory animals and companion animals, for example dogs, cats, pet birds and other pets are also included in this industry and classified to All other animal production (NAICS 11299)

NAICS 1151 and 1152 comprises establishments engaged in supportive activities for growing crops.
